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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

The Trustees present their report and the audited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2018. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in notes to the accounts and comply with the charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014 (as amended by Update Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

To express the essential unity in Christ in the Free Churches and to extend and realise His Kingdom through the advancement of the Christian Religion and the advancement of education, and the relief of poverty, hardship and distress.

To foster fellowship and work to promote united Christian action.

Public benefit

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning future activities. In particular, the trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities The Executive Committee (Trustees)

The trustees met regularly to conduct the affairs of the council.

The Secretary and Treasurer are elected annually with no limits to length of service. The President serves a three-year term.

Each of the denominations represented in the membership appoint a representative to serve as trustee. There are also five elected members nominated by member churches and elected by vote at the Annual General Meeting.

This committee has responsibility for approving grants for ministerial and related training as agreed in the grants policy which is reviewed annually. The committee also sets an annual subscription which was maintained in 2018 at £25 per church.

The Executive sets up sub-committees to run various activities and functions on its behalf. These report regularly to the Executive. Although a Finance Committee remains in place, it is wholly made up of trustees and for 2018 conducted its business within the trustees' meetings.

The President represents the Council at Civic Services and on other occasions when this is requested. Other officers deputise for the President when appropriate.

The activities overseen by the Executive are outlined in the accompanying Secretary and President's reports.

Secretary's Report 2018

During 2018, the Liverpool and District Free Church Federal Council has continued to pursue our core aims which are:

To support and encourage free churches in their work and witness across Merseyside

To particularly encourage pioneering, by enabling new pioneer ministries and seeking to network churches to learn and be inspired by their work.

To work ecumenically, bringing a particular Free Church contribution to Church life across Merseyside.

In 2018, we have also had some preliminary discussions with Green Pastures about how we might help churches engage with their work with homeless people.

We have sought to fulfil these aims through our usual activity base:

Grant provision

We have continued to offer grants to churches in accordance with our standing policies which continue to serve us well. Grants have been within budget for 2018. We reported in 2017 that we have adopted a slightly flexible approach to student grants to reflect changing patterns of ministry formation. This has now been formalised and we hope will enable further ministry development in future years. It is encouraging to continue to receive positive feedback from those who benefit from our church project grants. The Pioneer project in South Liverpool has now come to an end, but we are delighted to have supported a North Liverpool project enabled through Richmond Baptist Church. This has had early successes and the management group is working to explore how other churches can engage and learn from this project. We remain grateful to Lynne Barker for her effectiveness in operating this, along with her significant contribution as finance officer.

Administration

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Administration is currently being undertaken by the NWBA admin team, led by Mandy Howarth. Lynne Barker has continued to be employed by the Mersey Synod URC to act as finance officer - again we record our thanks for their meticulous and thorough support. The trustees review this arrangement annually and continue to believe that it best serves the operational needs of the charity.

SACRE

LFCFC is responsible for appointing Free Church representatives to the Standing Advisory Committees for Religious Education for Knowsley, Liverpool and Sefton. Jacqui Allward (Richmond Baptist Church) continues to serve in Liverpool. We continue to struggle to fill these roles.

Other Projects

LFCFC continues to operate as a representative body for Free Churches within the wider Ecumenical community on Merseyside. This has included participation in various civic events and the Merseyside Pentecost Festival. The council contributes to the travel costs of Free Church Leaders and its own officers when acting in such representative roles. We have also contributed to the Annual Pentecost Festival in Liverpool which is a focal point of Christian witness in the city. We also liaise regularly with RC and Anglican counterparts to raise relevant social issues and concerns through the Church Leaders engagements with civic authorities. We have also represented the Free Churches at the city's annual service of remembrance. We also hope to work with Green Pastures to develop some training resources to help churches engage in ministries with homeless people.

Presidents Report 2018

Over many years, the Liverpool and District Free Church Federal Council has supported local churches, ministers and students through grants and allowances. This year has been no exception. Fruitful investment of the legacies from our work in past decades allows us to continue to support the mission of Free Churches in our area by offering small grants towards projects such as holiday activities, and work with children or the elderly. Free Church ministers, and students studying for Free Church ministry, are supported with allowances for books and grants for holidays.

The Council also offers grants towards larger innovative mission projects, with an emphasis on the most deprived areas of Merseyside.

The new constitution has been filed with the Charities Commission. The objects of the charity are:

1.To express the essential unity in Christ in the Free Churches and to extend and realise His Kingdom through the advancement of the Christian Religion, the advancement of education and the relief of poverty, hardship and distress.

2. To foster fellowship in worship and work, and to promote united Christian action

At the Annual General Meeting on the 12th May Major Drew McCombe retired as President, as he is moving out of the area. I would like to take this opportunity to thank him for his contribution to the Free Church Federal Council over the time he has been in the Liverpool Area. Revd Jacky Embrey was nominated as President by the Executive, and Revd Phil Jump as Secretary. These nominations were unanimously approved. It was proposed by the Executive Committee that the position of Treasurer should be fulfilled by the Executive Committee as is the current arrangement. This was unanimously approved. The meeting appointed SB&P LLP, Oriel House, Bootle as auditors/independent examiners.

The meeting was followed by a presentation by Pastor Pete Cunningham on 'A place to call home.' This is an exciting project with the aim of ending homelessness in Merseyside. His organisation, Green Pastures, buys property for churches and Christian charities so that they can reach out and house the homeless in their area. Green Pastures provides all the paperwork, expertise and ongoing support to operate a successful supported housing project.

Finally, I would take this opportunity to thank Ian Hu, who has contributed to the work for a number of years as a member of the Executive and our Administrative Assistants, Lynne Barker and Mandy Howarth, who ensure that grants are paid and that minutes of meetings are produced.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The Council shall retain a reserve of at least one year's total running costs, not including the amount of any grants or other discretionary payments it may regularly choose to make.

It is recognised that the present reserves are considerable compared to the running costs of the charity. The current priority of the trustees is to maximise income while retaining capital, and to expend generated income on an annual basis to further the objectives of the charity.

The trustees will remain open to capital projects and investments which further the objectives of the charity on a strategic and long term basis. Subject to appropriate consultation with member churches, the charity's operational strategy can be adjusted to enable such investments and projects.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The charity appoints new trustees when necessary. Appropriate training is provided by the charity, if the trustee is not a trustee of another charity. As part of the induction process, each new trustee is given a copy of the Charity's scheme and the latest report and statement of accounts.

Membership

Membership is open to any church within the boroughs of Liverpool, Knowsley, Sefton and Wirral whose denomination is in membership of the National Free Churches Group. Churches are invited to register annually.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 (as updated through Update Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act 2011 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The charity has applied Update Bulletin 1 as published on 2 February 2016 and does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

No amount is included in the financial statements for volunteer time in line with the SORP (FRS 102).

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over.



Support costs

Support costs are those that assist the work of the charity but do not directly represent charitable activities and include office costs, governance costs, administrative payroll costs. They are incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity. Where support costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to cost of raising funds and expenditure on charitable activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are General Funds that can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Investments

Investments are shown at market value at the balance sheet date. Realised and unrealised gains and losses on investments are included in the Statement of Financial Activities.

Tangible Assets

Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of £1,000 or less are written off when the asset is acquired.
